Ride horses to carry out stock work



This resource provides a basic introduction in what to do to become a good stock camp team member and about being mindful of safety of riders and horses. Some *basic* methods of and procedures for preparing horses for and after work and elementary horsemanship activities are demonstrated and explained in eighteen short video clips embedded in three eLearning modules.

To accommodate learners with English language or literacy difficulties, the three interactive, self-paced e-learning modules present essential knowledge and skills on slides with embedded video clips, animated text, images, and explanatory audio and reinforce knowledge with summaries and activities. The resource uses plain English except where workplace jargon needs to be learned.
